Barton Bears struggled through a late September game to defeat the Blue Devils 13-12. The game was played at Hughes.

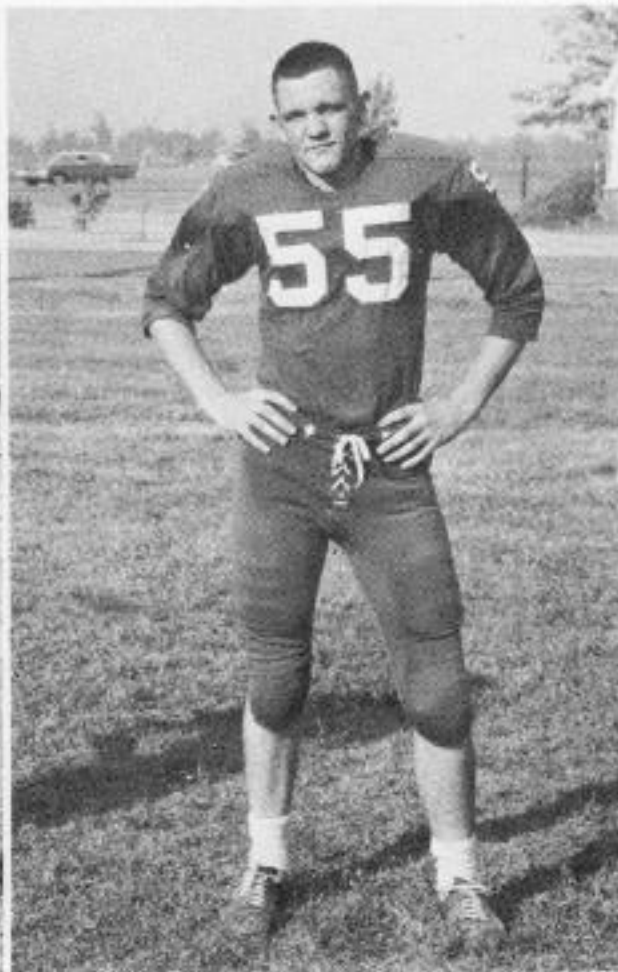

The 21-0 loss to Parkin came on the Tigers' home field and gave their supporters an opportunity to see a homecoming victory.



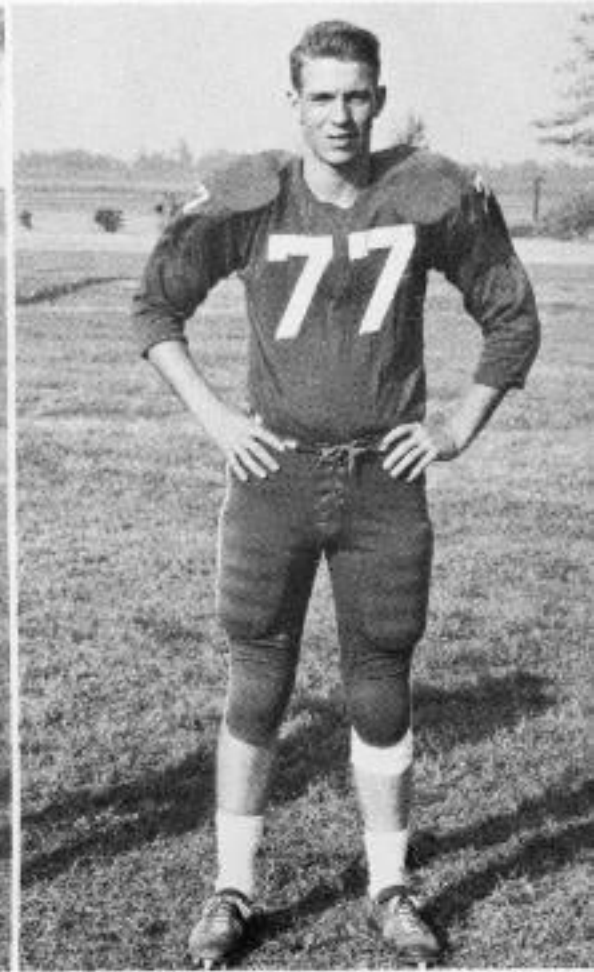

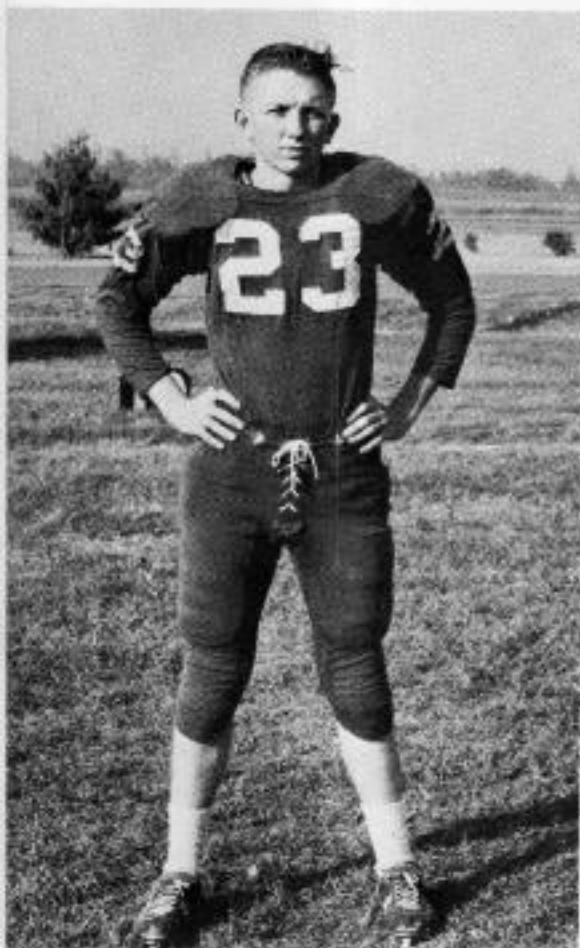

In their last game they met the Wilson Bull Dogs on the local field and Reeves scored the two touchdowns for the 14-6 victory.



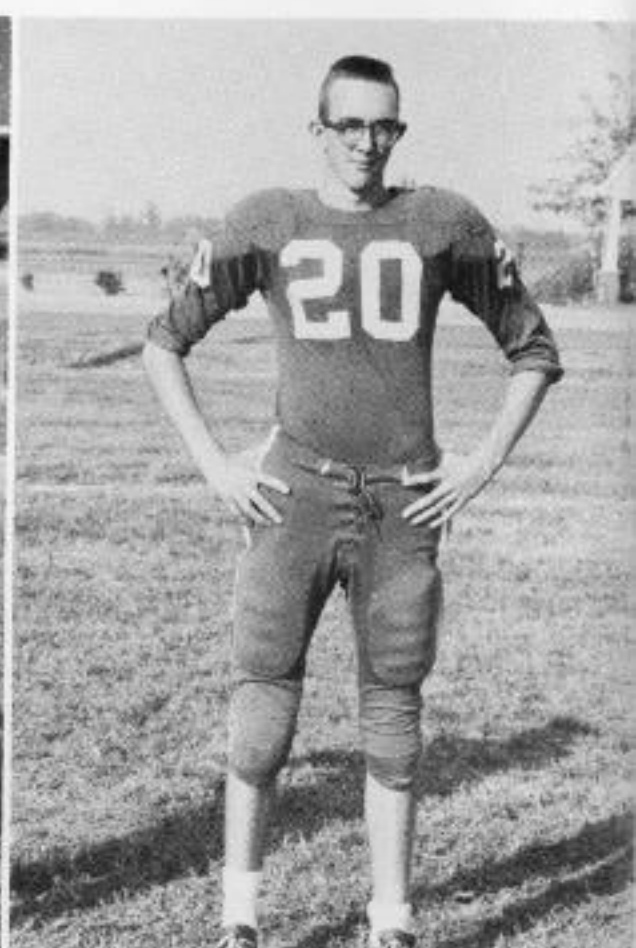
