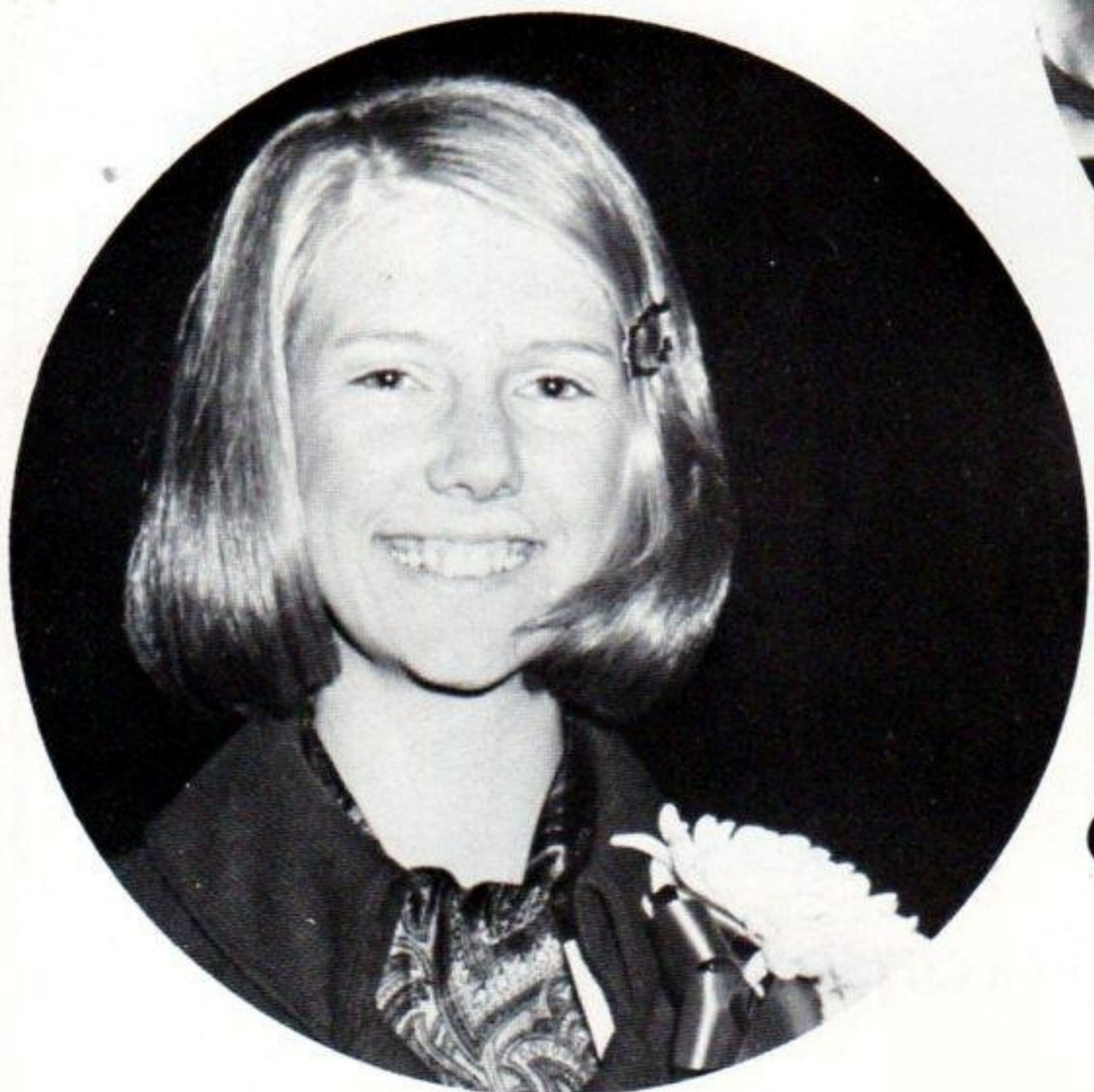

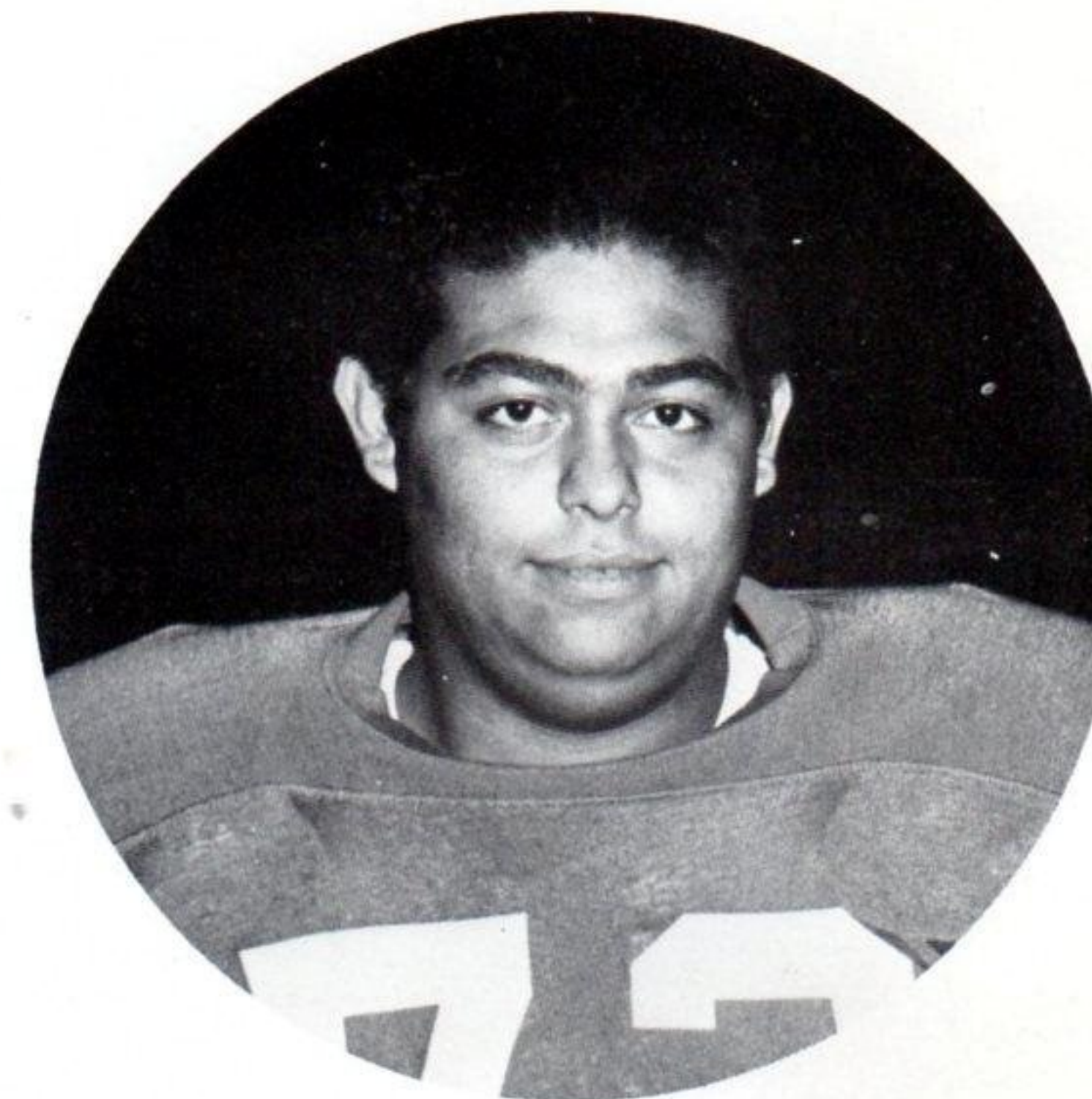

PRESIDENT OF HUGHES SCHOOL BOARD 1946-71

At 10:00 a. m. on Friday morning, February 5, 1971, students in the Hughes School District paid tribute to a genuine friend of education, Mr. Bert C. Pouncey, Jr., as they observed two minutes of silence in memory of this school leader.

This was a man who gave a year of his time to serve as superintendent of schools during the 1958-59 school year. He was a person who moved in such a quiet and effective manner that changes were made easily under his leadership.

A tribute paid to him by a long-time friend, Paul Kelly, Jr., says: "He will be greatly missed by many in Hughes community. He was a kind man who treated everyone with respect ... There will be an empty gap for a long time."

The approach to the new addition is viewed from a sidewalk leading between attractive grillwork and the new structure.

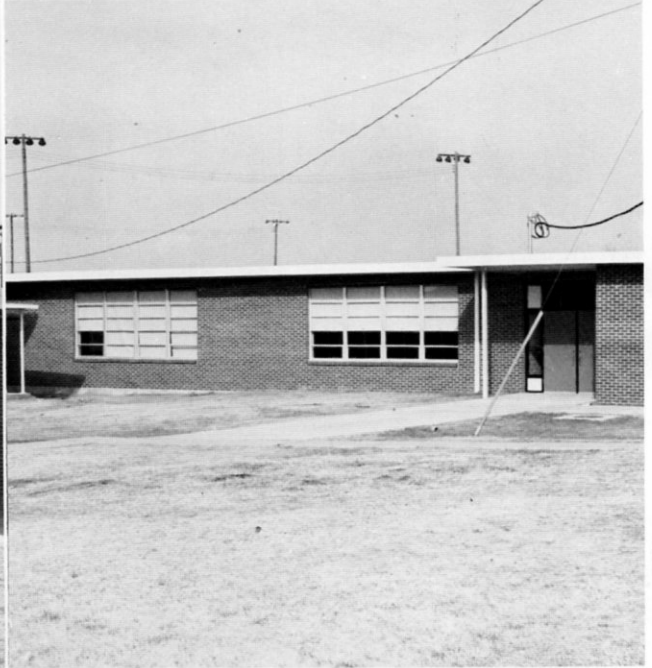

To the best of his judgment decisions were made which were for the best interests of the greatest number.

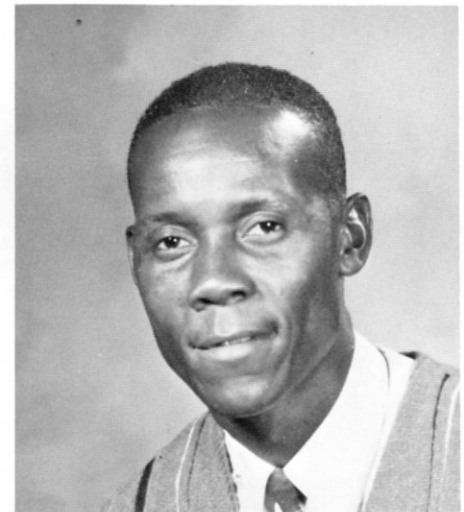

Because she has enriched the lives of so many boys and girls, The Progressive Farmer names Miss Julia McKemie Woman of the Year in service to rural families in Arkansas.

For the past 12 years youngsters in Hughes High School have looked to their counselor, Miss McKemie, for help in solving personal and educational problems, as well as guiding them into successful and satisfying careers.

"I am always so pleased when I see former students assume roles of doctors, lawyers, and leaders in the community," says Miss McKemie.

But her influence does not stop in Hughes. This popular counselor is a leader of leaders. She is executive secretary for the Arkansas Association of Student Councils. In 1948 she organized along with three other educators a student council leadership workshop—the first in the nation. The workshop received national attention and has been used as a model for hundreds of such workshops throughout the United States. She has served as student council consultant for both workshops and conventions in Texas, Mississippi, Louisiana, North Carolina, South Carolina, Kentucky, Florida, Oklahoma, Tennessee, and Arkansas. These conventions involve both faculty and students. She has also worked with the Southern Association of Student Councils which is composed of 14 Southern states and has served as adviser for states west of the Mississippi River.

Three years ago, with the authorization of the National Association of Secondary School Principals, this popular counselor organized a national leadership

training camp at Camp Couchdale in Hot Springs and has directed the program each year since. More recently she organized a one-day meeting of educators from Arkansas, Mississippi, Tennessee, and Missouri for a study concerning student unrest.

Under her leadership as executive secretary of the Arkansas Association of Student Councils, the organization has received from the national association certificates of commendation for the past 12 years for being an outstanding organization and for work done on the state, regional, and national levels.

In addition to being a high school counselor, this busy educator has found time for volunteer work with Arkansas Girls State. Since 1953 she has helped plan the instructional program for the 1,000 girls who attend. The girls learn women's place in Government and how the Government works. They are required to learn the first and last stanzas of the "Star Spangled Banner." The program is planned to instill a love and pride in their Government.

Although Miss McKemie makes valuable contributions on a state and national basis, she does not neglect local aspects. She gives unsparingly of her time to her hometown church and community activities. She has taken an active part in local and state Junior Miss Pageants.

When she's not working directly with girls and boys she is busy writing. She has had articles published in newspapers and magazines and is compiling material for devotionals and bulletin boards for high schools.

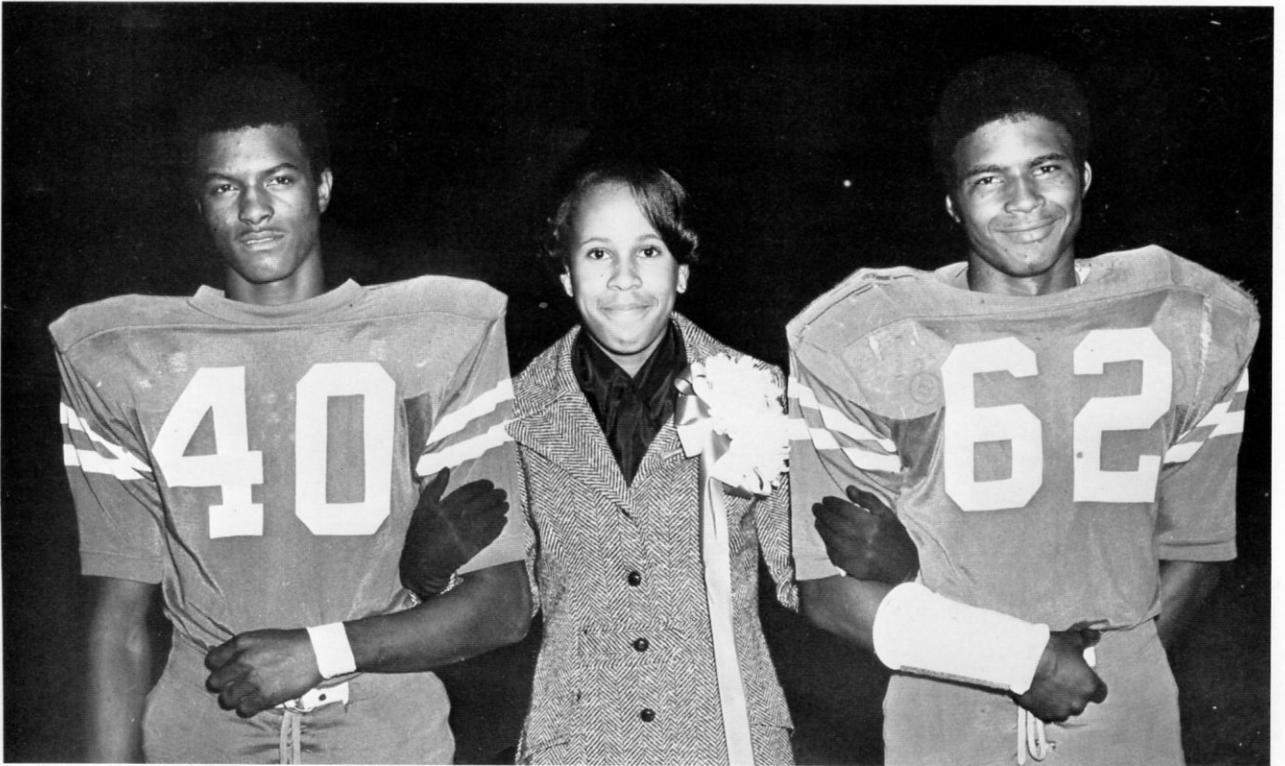


Soon all were seated for a pleasant evening of food and fellowship and talk of old times.
