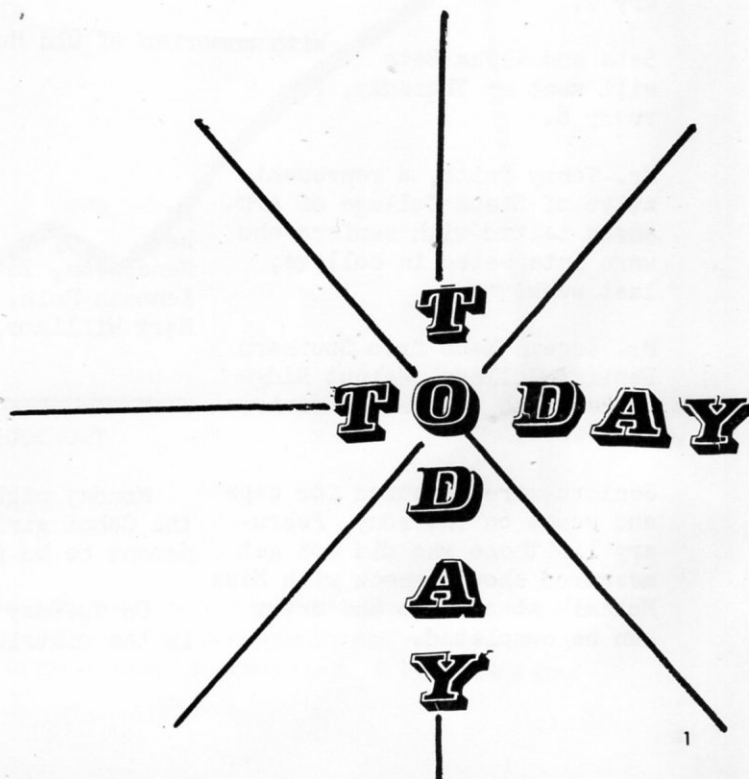

Seniors were measured for caps and gowns on Thursday, February 1. Those who did not get measured should check with Miss McKemie at once so the order can be completed.

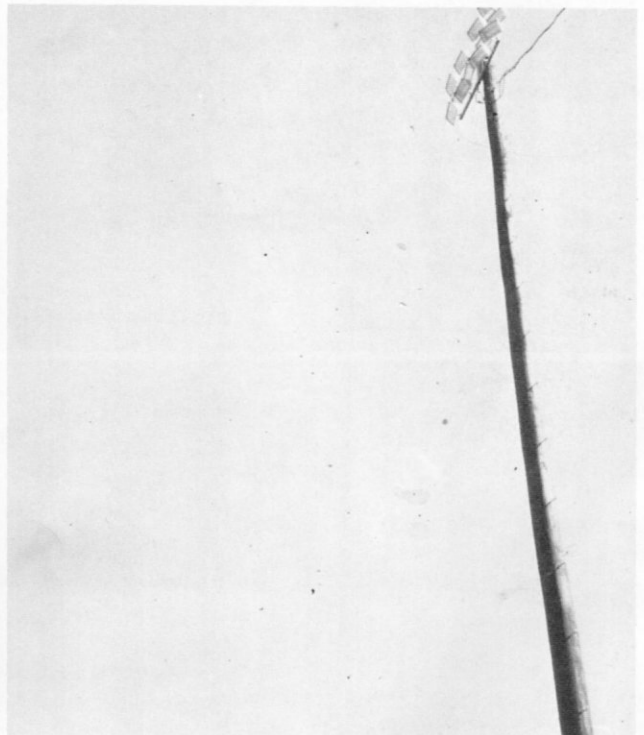
Monday night at 6:45 the Hughes Devilettes will meet the Cabot girls in opening play of the Senior Girls tournament to be played at Lonoke this week.

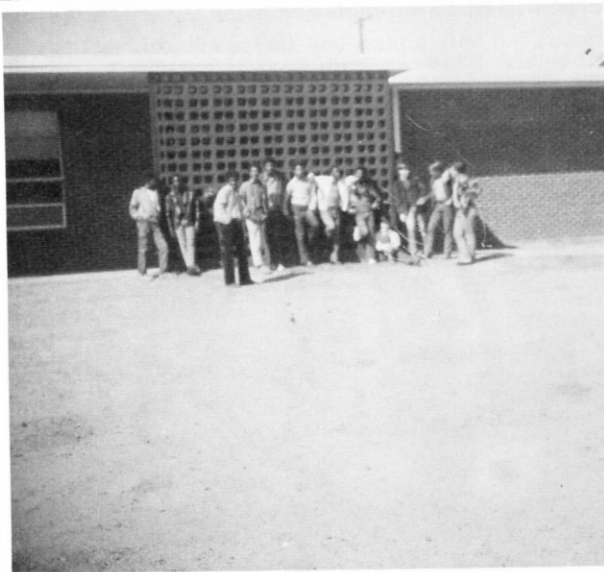

In keeping with the spirit of the Home-coming week, classes decorated the doors of their first period classrooms.

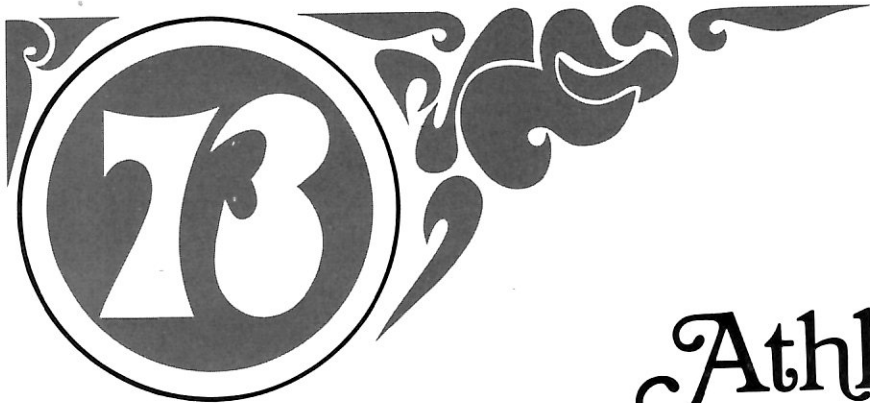
Seniors were proud of the members of the team who had first period English. The decoration calls attention to team members in that first period class.
