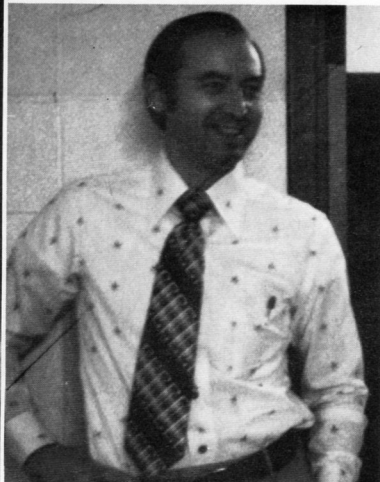

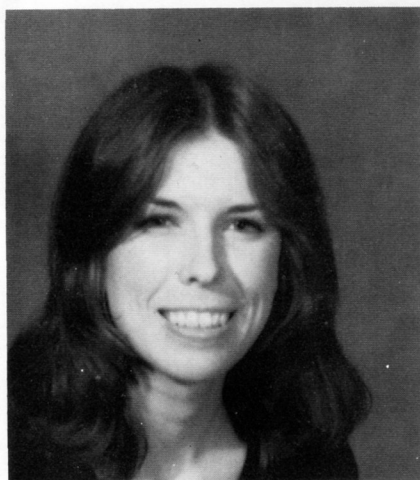
A Brief History

In 1912 Miss Ernestine Vance was the first teacher in Hughes. She was followed by Miss Stella Andrews who taught in 1914-15 and who married the first school board president, Mr. R. C. Nickle.

Other early teachers were Miss Loraine Massey in 1916, Miss Janie Sharp in 1917, Miss Seals in 1918, and Miss Alice Moore, who is now Mrs. T. H. Tucker, joined the school program in 1920.

Mr. Harry Williamson became the first superintendent of schools in 1931 and he was followed by Mr. Roy Nelson in 1937.

The present superintendent came to Hughes in the fall of 1959. Last May he completed sixteen years of leadership for the Hughes School system.



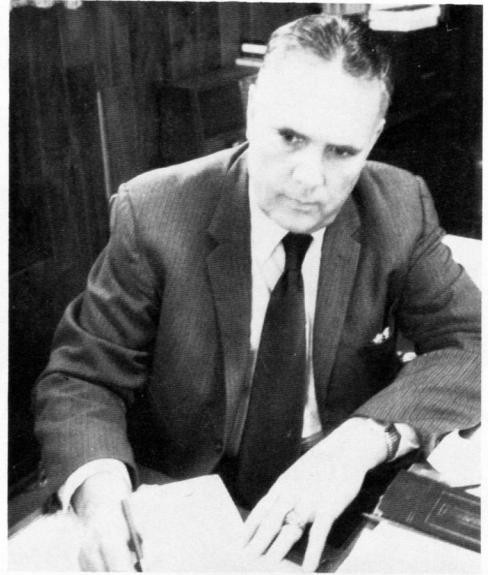
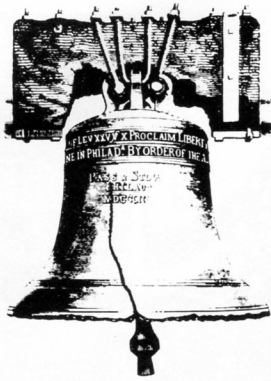

Mrs. Beasley says that her favorite quote is "This above all: to thine own self be true, and it must follow as the night the day, Thou canst not then be false to any man."

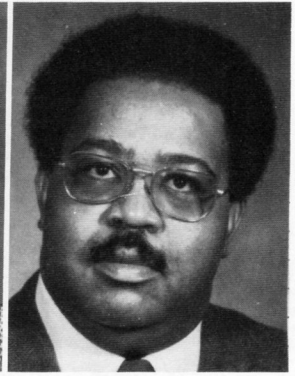

To Mr. Bowens the most vivid memory of teaching was the experience of having a former high school student as student teacher.



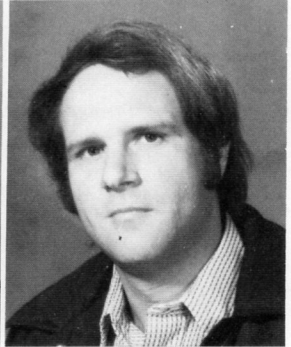

Excellent advice from Mr. Mike Bullard is "No matter how good you do anything, you could always do it a little better."

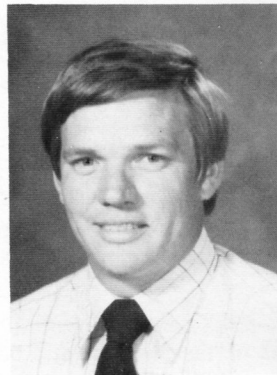
Mrs. Card offers advice also and she says, "Live each day as it comes - do the best you can and trust God to take care of the rest."

When asked to give advice to students, Mr. Farley said, "The wisest thing you can do is not to do something just simply because the rest of the crowd did. Do what is right."

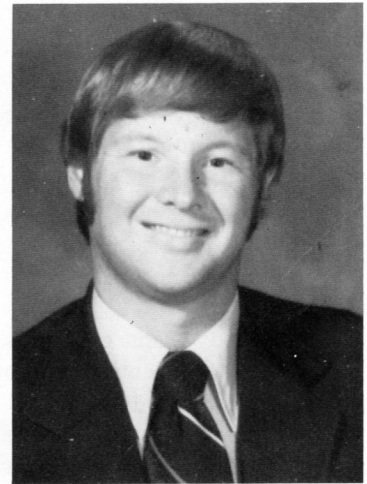
Mr. Don Holloway offers this thought for students: "Do the things that ought to be done, the way they should be done, at the time they should be done - whether you want to do them or not."

"Have a purpose in life," says Mrs. Adlea Hardin. "Have a good aim in mind and strive to attain it."

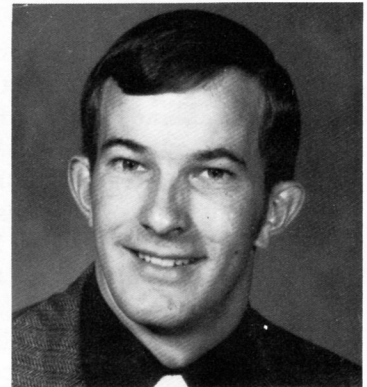

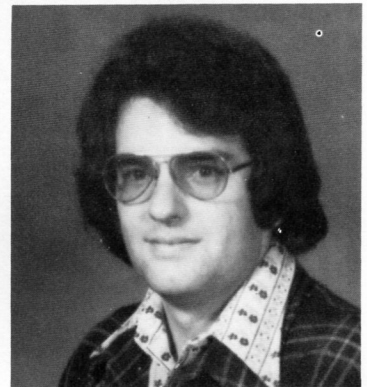

Mr. Smith counts this as his most vivid memory of teaching - being able to see the look on the face of students when they learn something that they did not understand before."

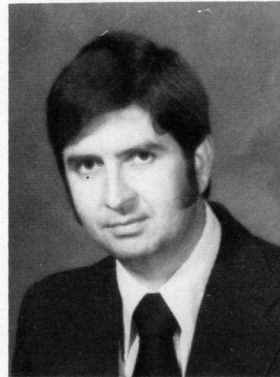

Manuel Hardaway, Billy Lock, Eddie Lewis, David Chiang, and Frances Vent helped motivate the membership during the 1974-75 year.

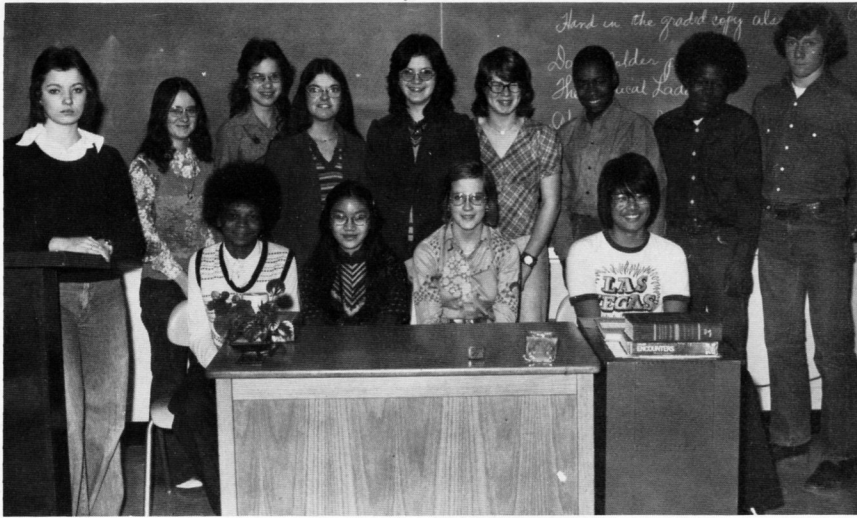

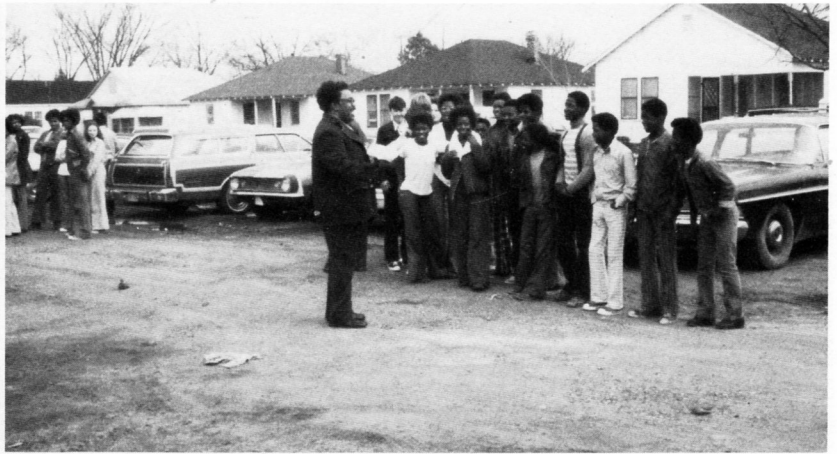

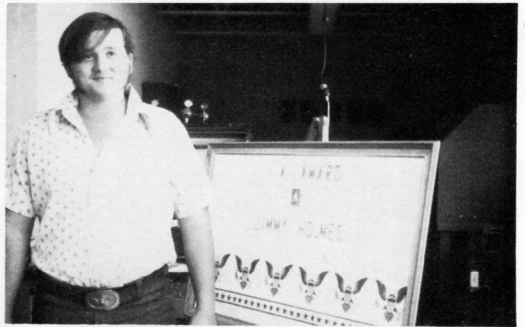
Industrial Arts Club

Homecoming 1975

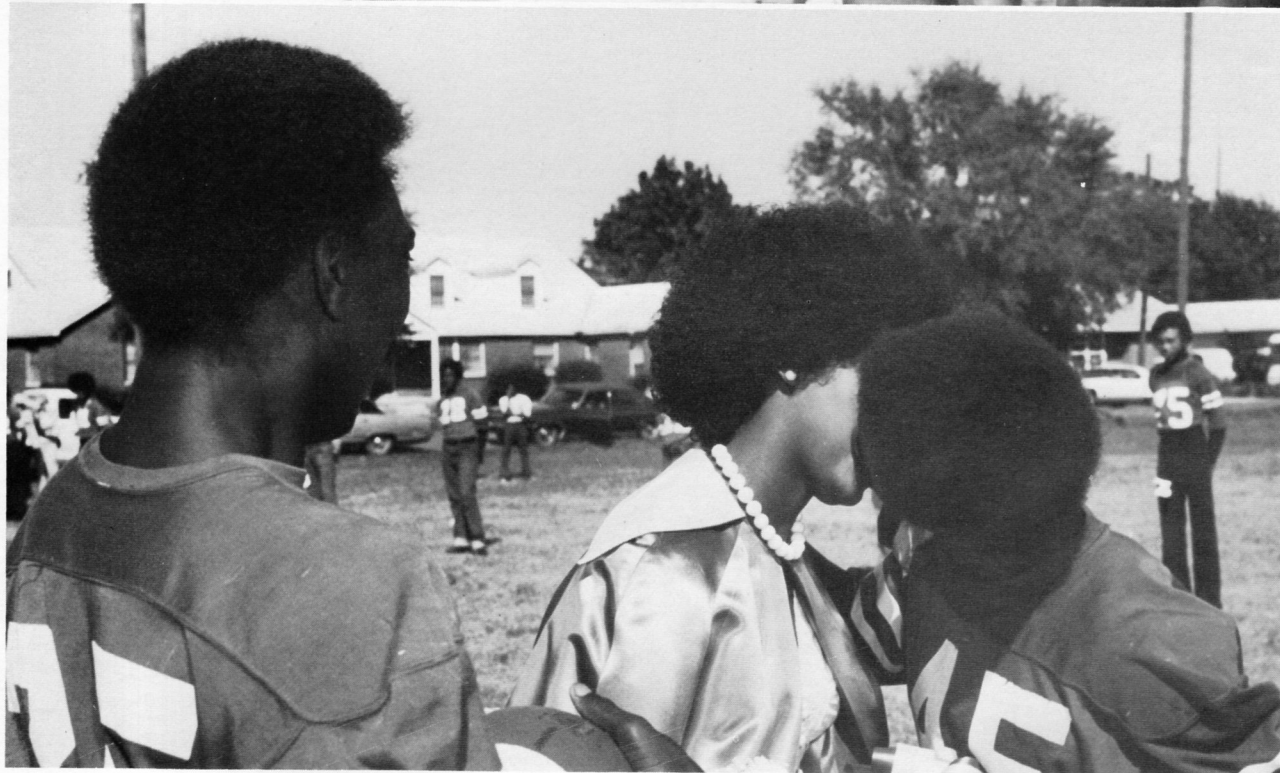
The highlight of Homecoming 1975 came as all attention was focused on Queen Essie Small and her escorts Curtis Speed and Ernest Horton.

As Senior Gwen wishes a Devil victory for Andrew Joshaway, she reflects back over the events of her high school years.

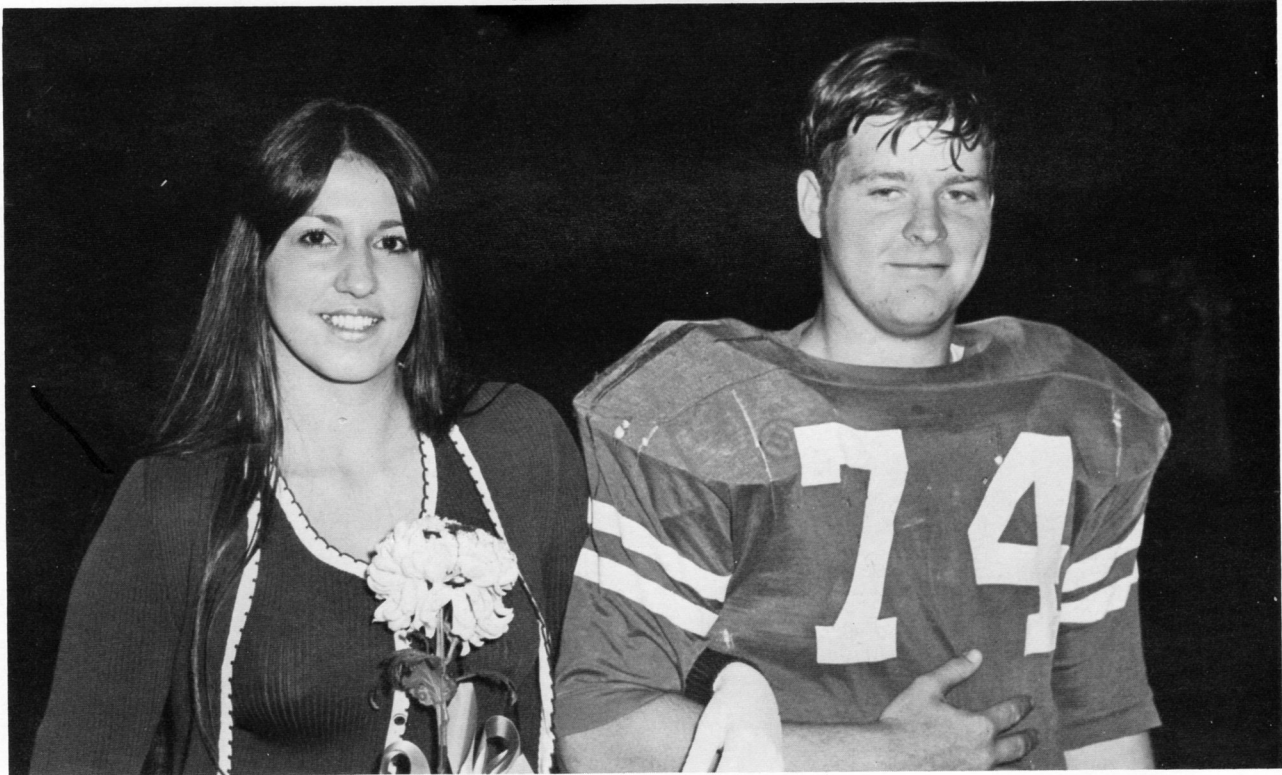
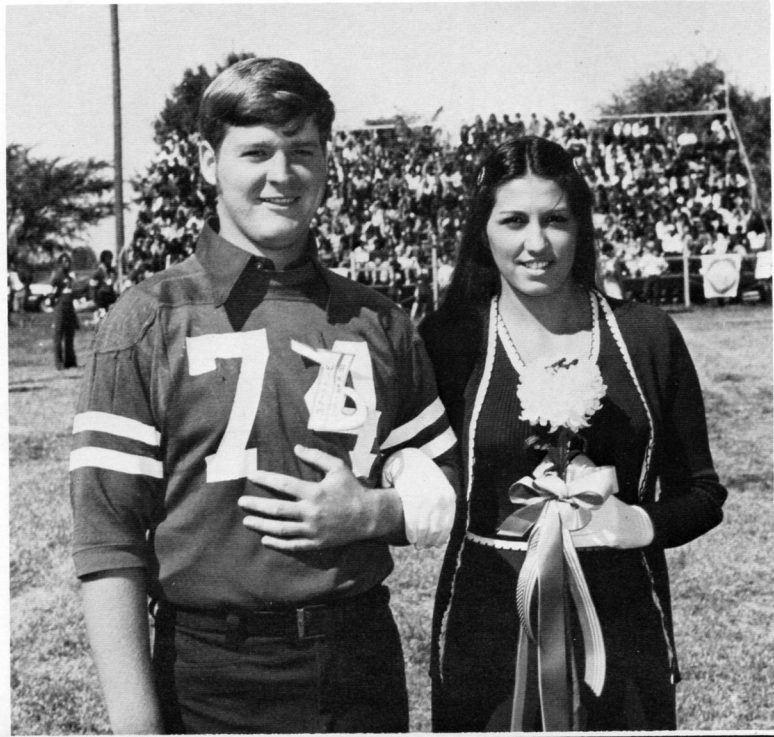
Gwen has been a member of the Future Teachers and is this year serving as vice president. She has also worked in Student Council and Future Homemakers of America.

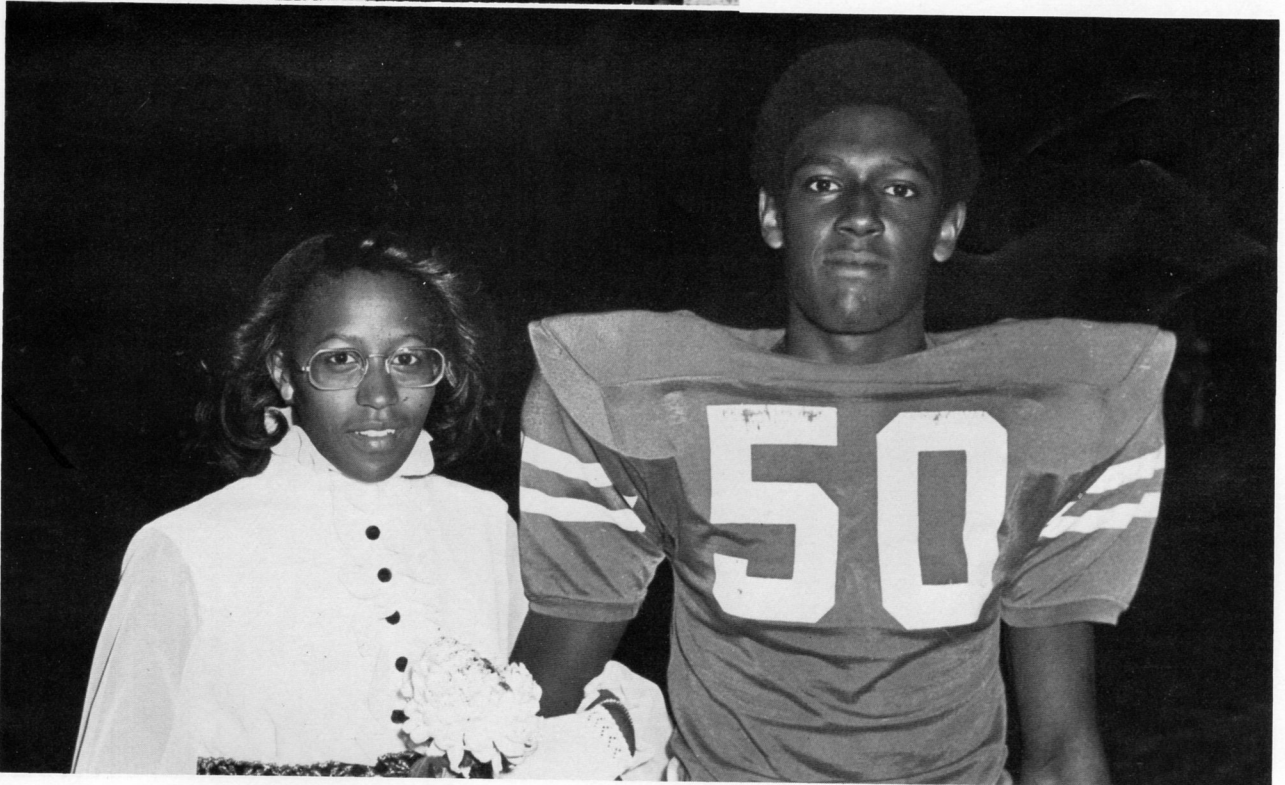

The field was surrounded with a color guard of flag bearers who were members of the Imps, the junior high team. An honor guard stood at attention on the 40 yard line.

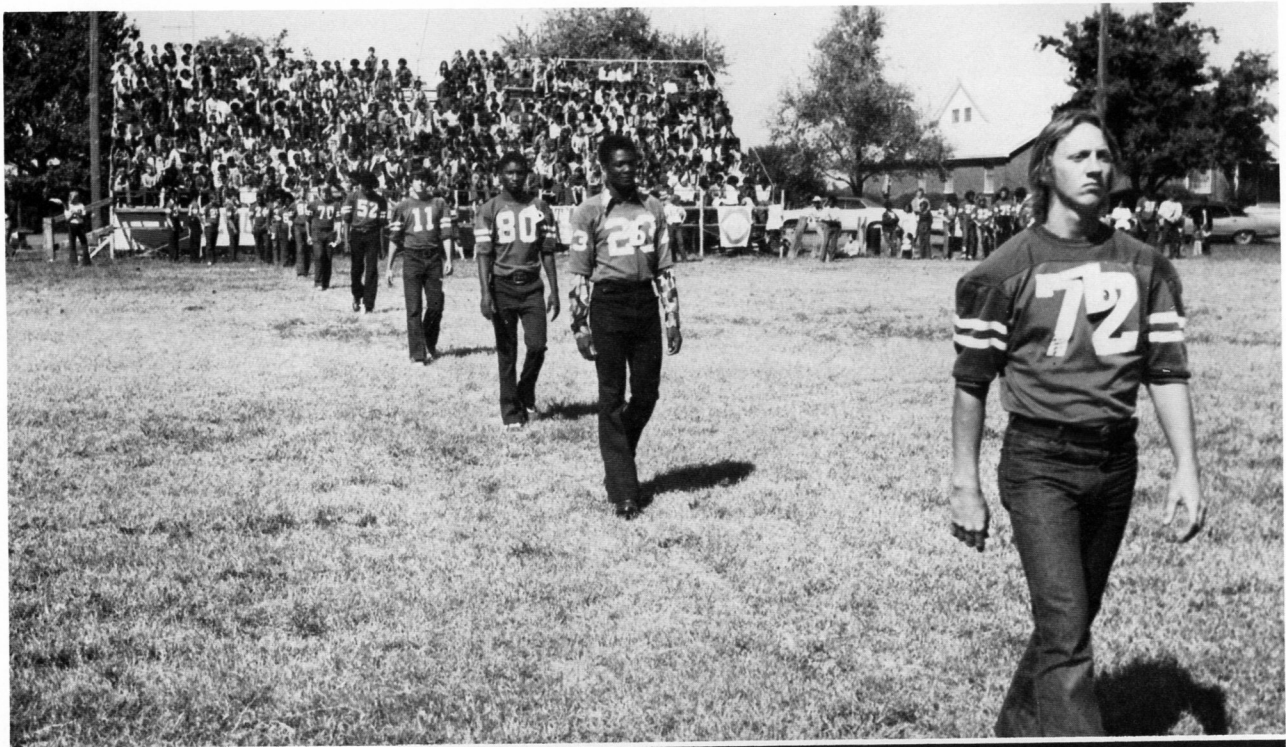

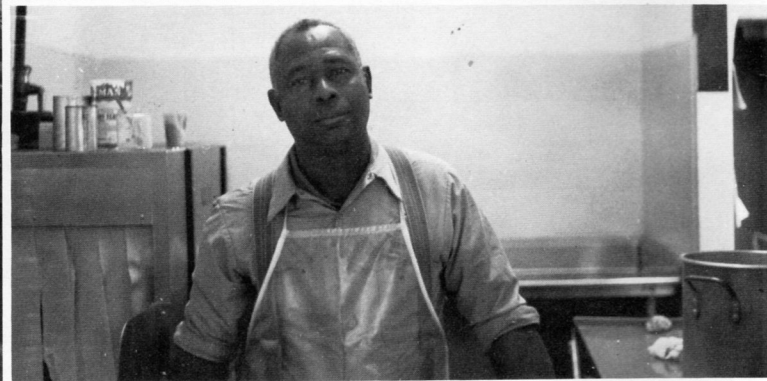
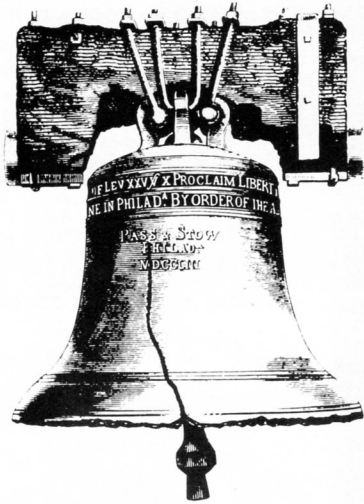
A Hot Lunch Is Served Each Day.

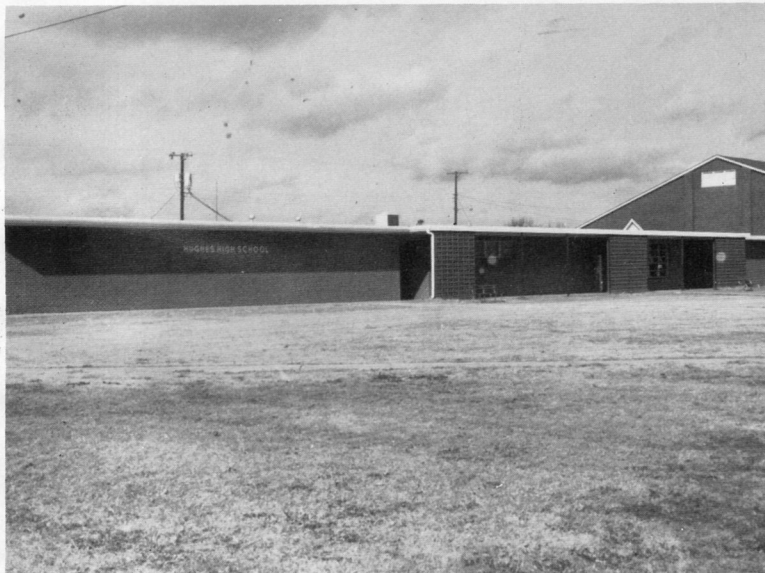
Other Activities at Hughes High School.
