All dignity was soon forgotten as the student body and cheerlead-ers whipped into a yell for the Devils.

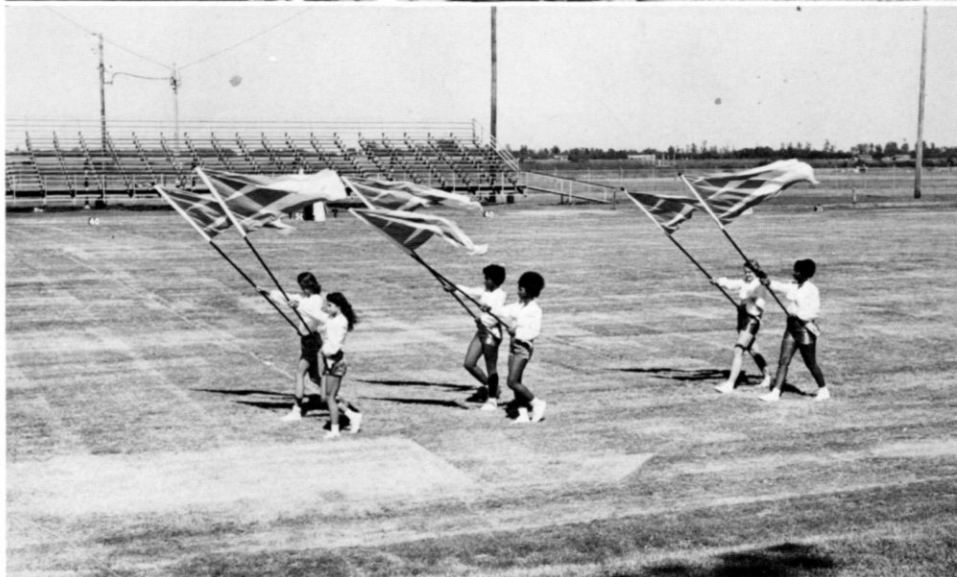

"Close Encounters of the Devil Kind" was the theme of the afternoon activity. The parade featured a line of banners showing how the clubs felt about winning.

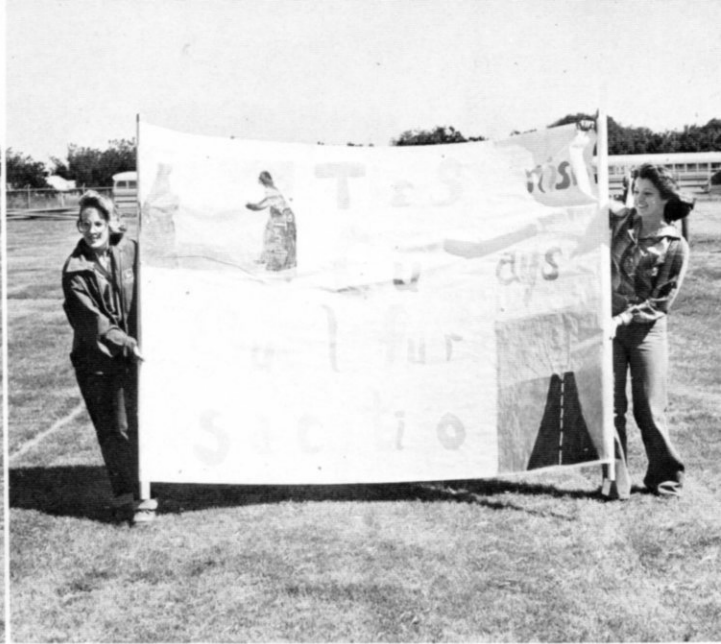

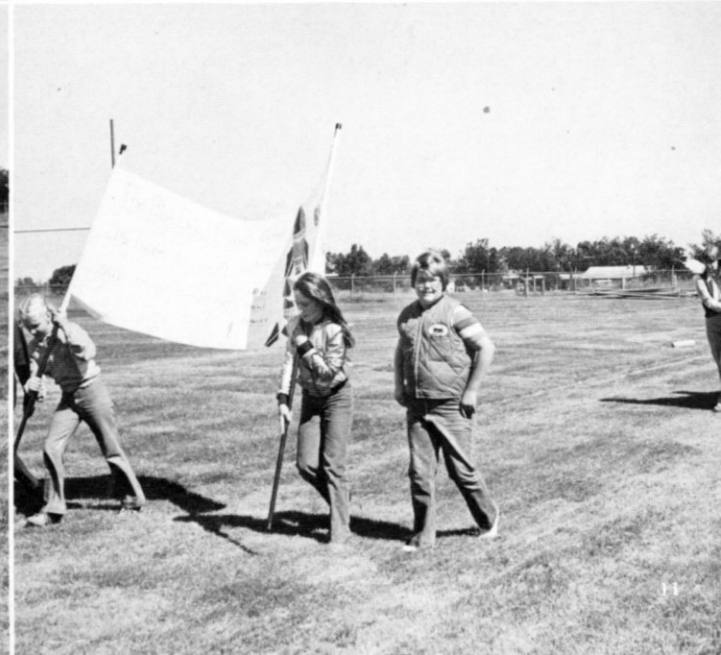

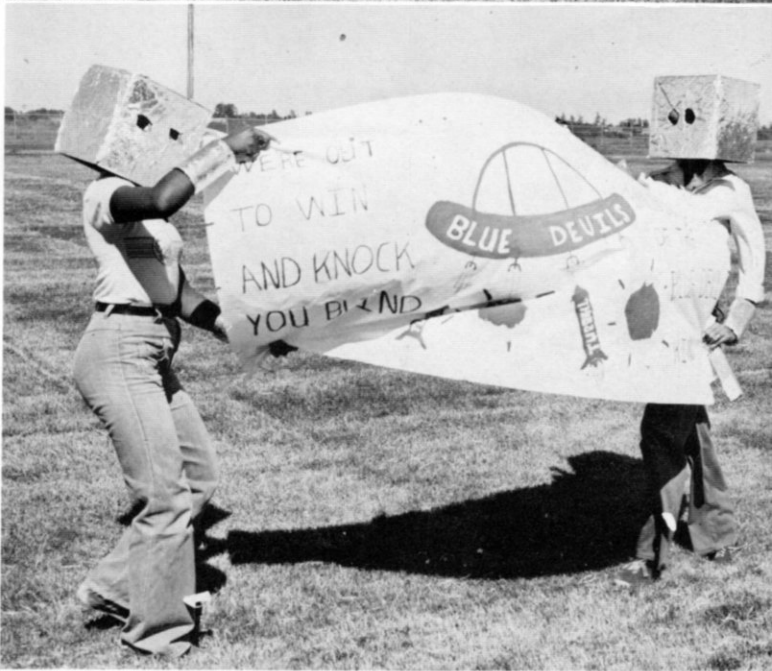

The band took a beating with a high wind which distorted the notes and sometimes scattered the music.

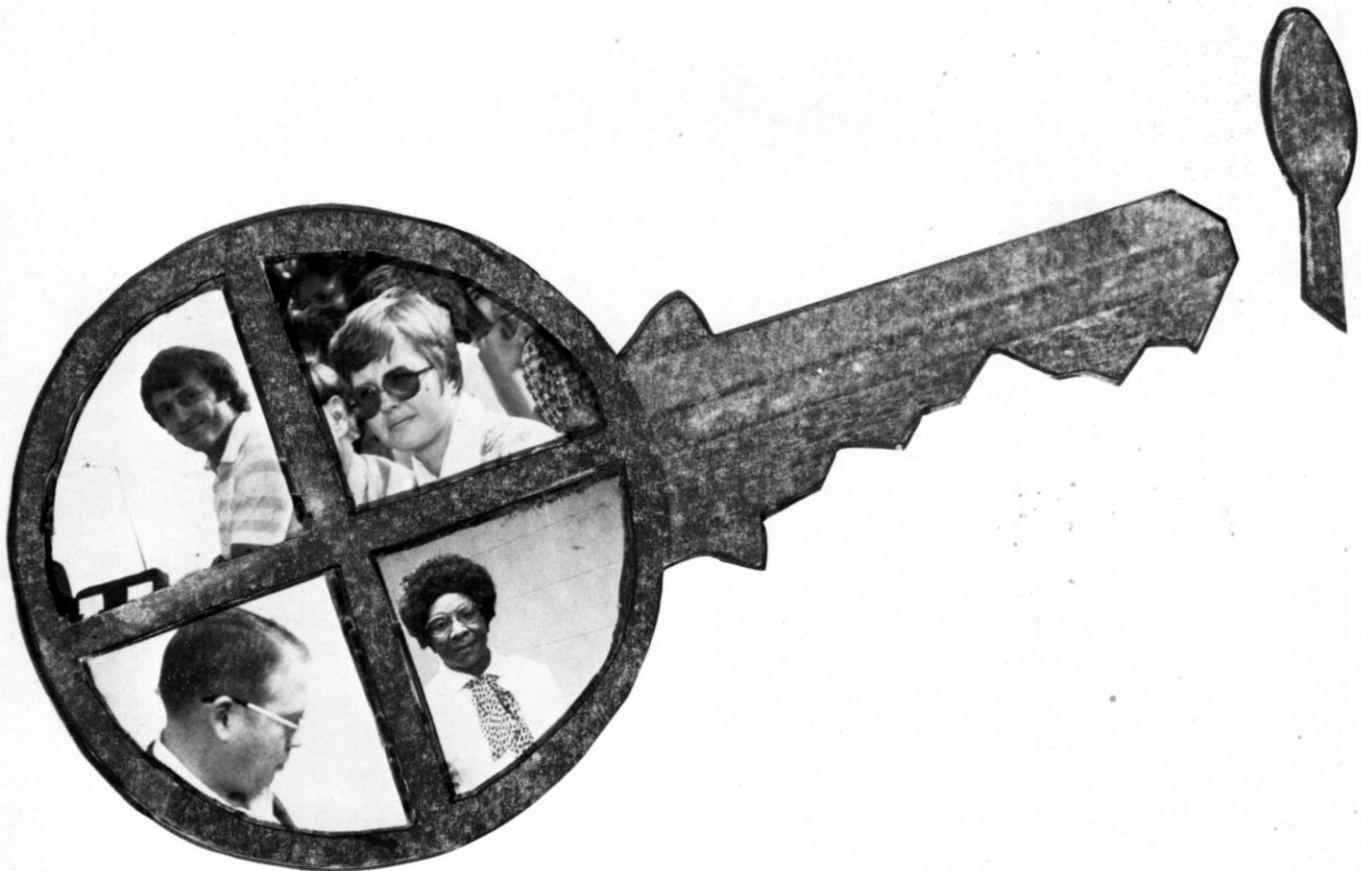

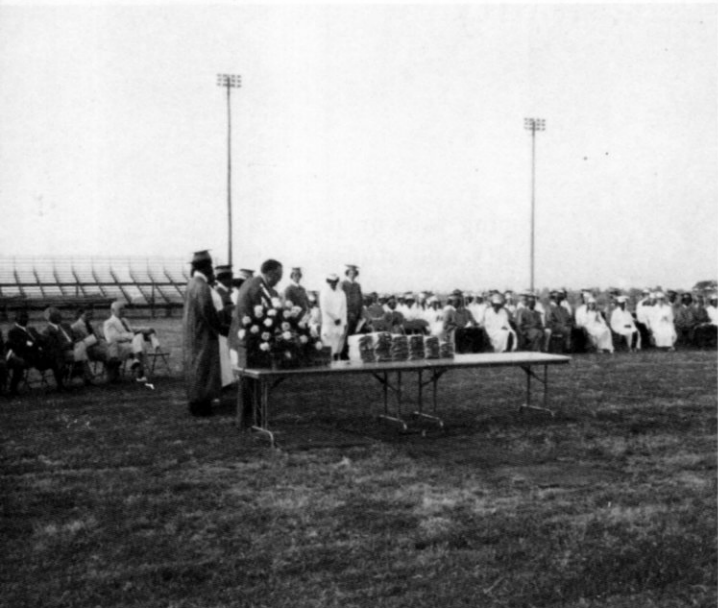
# Administration and Faculty



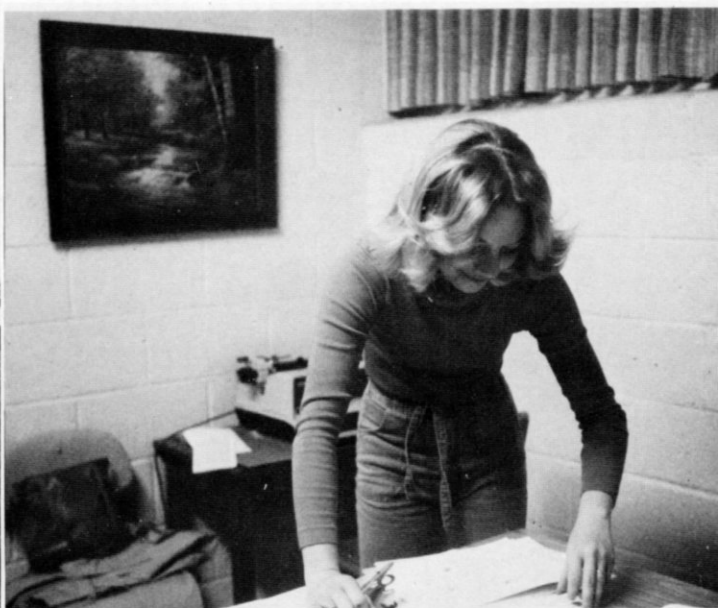

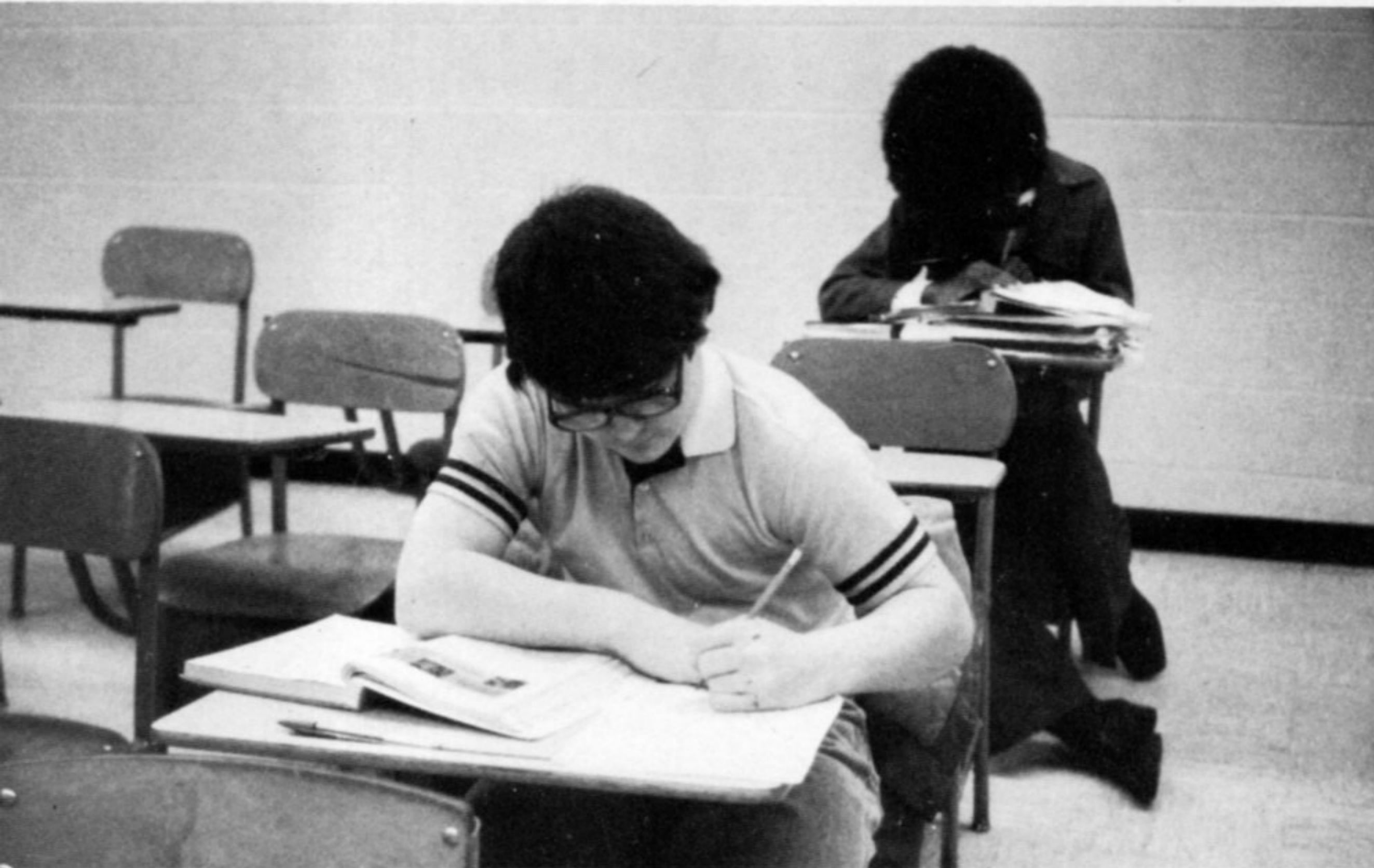
## School and What It's All About . . .

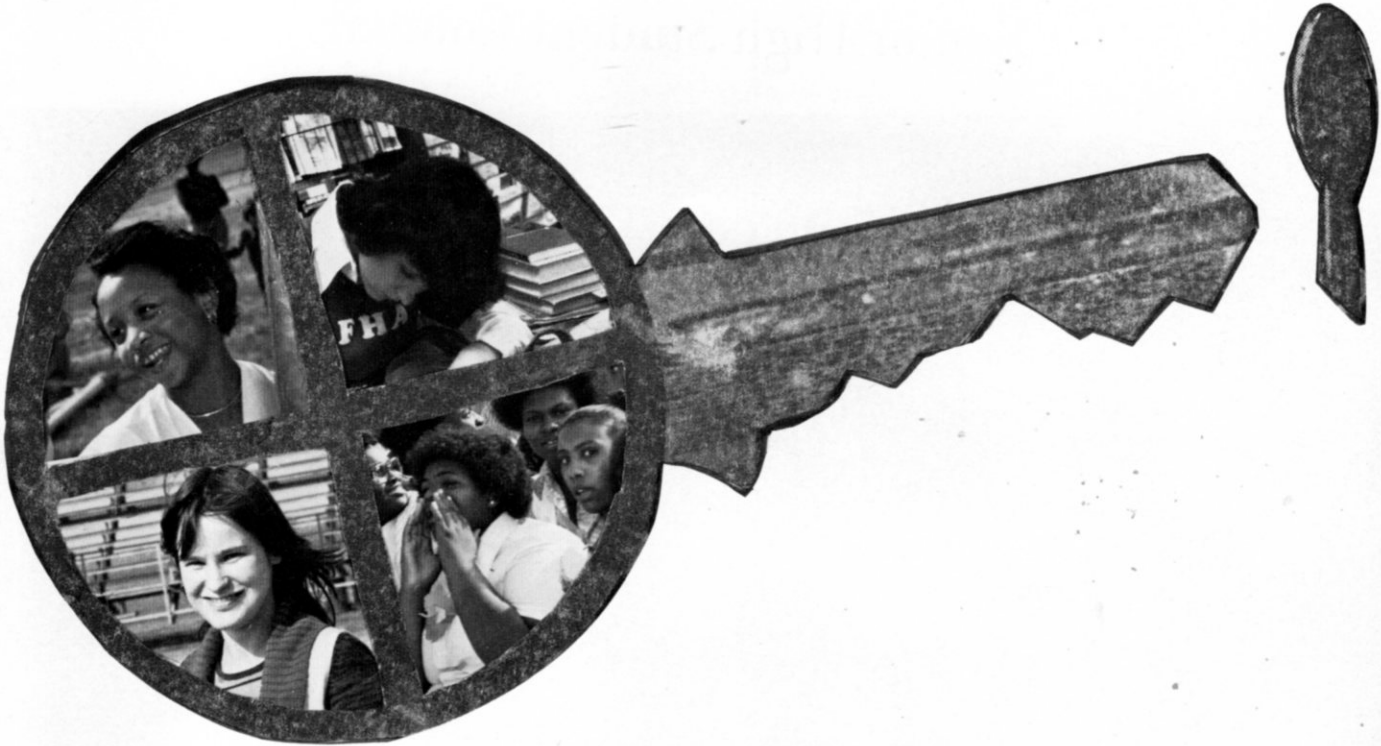
School is all about study. Once the organization is underway some students settle for a first study hall which is used for just what it says "Study".
