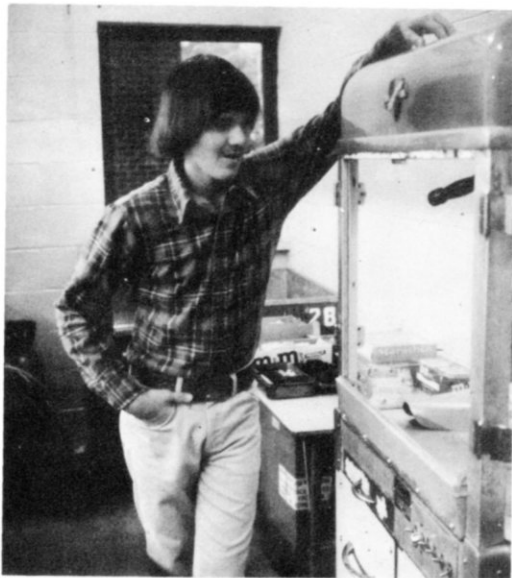

For the past year one of the main concerns of all administrative staff under the direction of the superintendent of schools, Mr. Roy Stobaugh, has been evaluation. Throughout Arkansas an effort is being made to have all elementary schools meet requirements for North Central Association membership. After intensive study, the Hughes Elementary school was able to fulfill all parts of the self-evaluation study. The team came to visit in October and the follow-up visit was made in January. Thus the local elementary school is among the first thirty-five school districts in the state seeking accreditation by NCA.



Mr. Stobaugh and Mr. Afton Bradshaw, elementary supervisor from the State Department of Education, spent a lot of time in planning and implementation of all parts of the study.

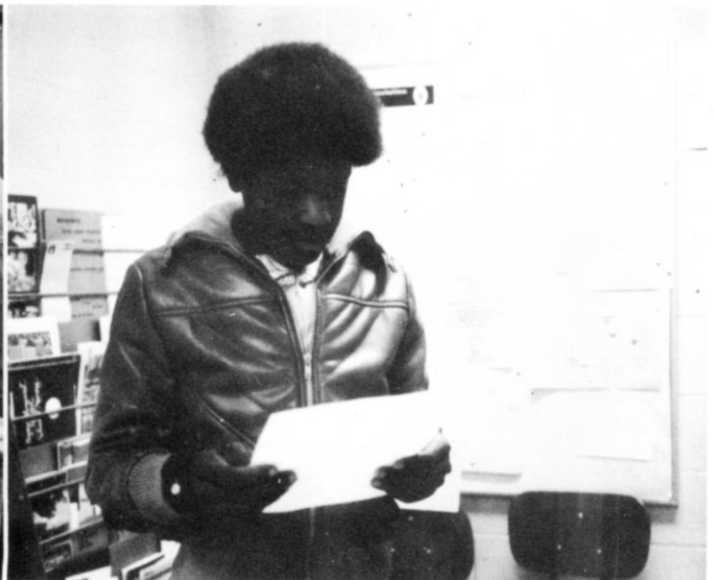

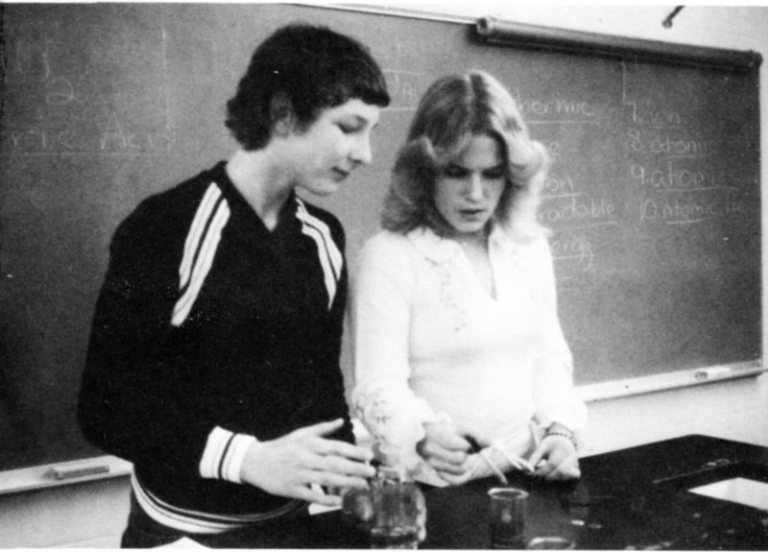
